

RHSQ Journal Policy

The Royal Historical Society of Queensland Journal publishes papers on the history of both Queensland, and the Commonwealth of Australia and adjacent islands of the Pacific. Papers on topics not of national significance and of relevance solely to states other than Queensland will not normally be considered. Authors need not be members of the Society.

Manuscripts should be provided typed on one side of the paper using double spacing with ample margins and should not exceed 6,000 words. The submission of short papers is encouraged. Maps and glossy photographs for illustration should accompany the paper as either hard copies, or digitally as separate jpg files. It is the responsibility of the author to obtain permission to publish images. Papers are subject to editorial and academic papers to peer review before publication.

Manuscripts should follow the guidelines set out in the Style Guide, a copy of which is available at www.queenslandhistory.org.au or on request from the Society. Manuscripts may also be submitted by email to journal@queenslandhistory.org.au. Hard copies may be sent to the Editors, RHSQ Journal, PO Box 12057, Brisbane George Street, Qld, 4003.

It is a condition of publication in the *Journal* that the paper has not already been published or is not being published elsewhere. The author warrants to the Society that the article submitted to the Society for publication is an original work and does not contravene the *Australian Copyright Act*. Copyright in the text of each paper published in the *Journal* remains with the author, but the author gives to the Society a licence to reproduce the paper for Society purposes.

The Editors also welcome letters, particularly relating to papers previously published in the *Journal*. To encourage debate and further research, the Editors will publish suitable letters or extracts from them.

The Royal Historical Society of Queensland publishes its *Journal* quarterly and from February to December a monthly bulletin. The Society's headquarters are located at the Commissariat Store, 115 William Street, Brisbane which houses the Society's library and museum. The Society welcomes applications for membership from all persons interested in history, and organizes lectures, seminars and conferences.
