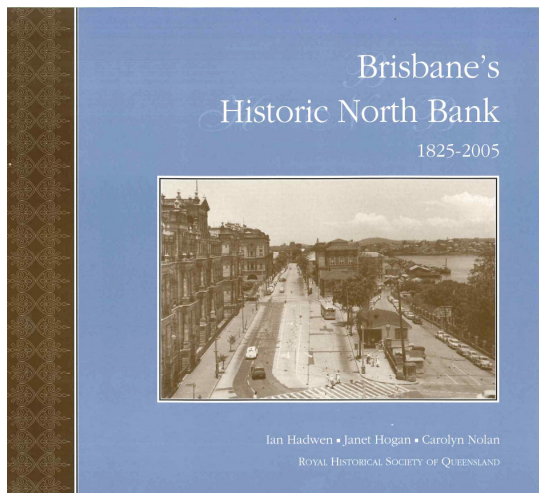

An illustrated history of the William Street precinct.

Authors, Ian Hadwen, Janet Hogan and Carolyn Nolan, all members of the Royal Historical Society of Queensland have collected and described in detail images of historic William Street. Notable buildings include Old Government House, Parliament House, the Government Printing Office, the Immigration Depot (now National Trust House), the Lands Office (now Hotel Conrad and the Treasury Building (now Treasury Casino). The book includes buildings that have been demolished such as St John's Pro-Cathedral, the Evangelical Chapel and the Prudential Building. 90 pp including B & W and colour photographs.

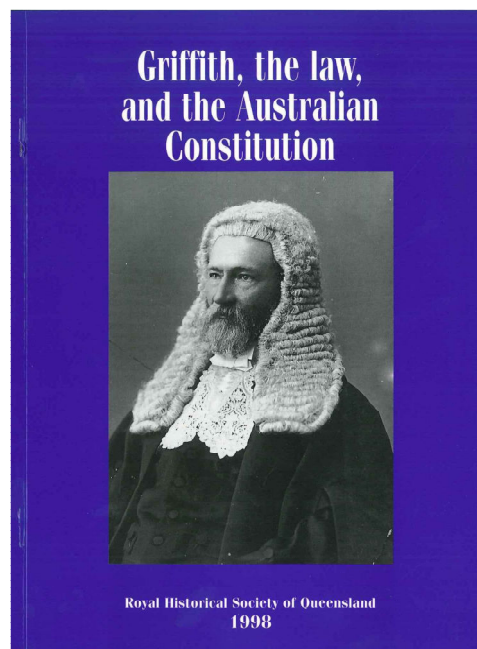
The Fell Tyrant is a republication of a pamphlet written by William Ross, a convict who served as a constable and overseer in Brisbane Town from 1826-1832. His tyrant is Patrick Logan, notorious Commandant of the Moreton Bay Penal Colony. Edited and annotated by prominent Brisbane historians Jennifer Harrison and JG Steele, both John Douglas Kerr Medallists of the Royal Historical Society of Queensland. Illustrations and specially drawn maps and plans of contemporary London and Moreton Bay, and a timeline, complement the text. 83 pp illustrated

History of the Commissariat Store

'Constructed in 1829 to serve the Moreton Bay Penal Settlement, the Commissariat Store is the oldest public building in Queensland.'. In William Street, not far from the present Victoria Bridge, it was constructed in stone under the direction of Commandant Patrick Logan to house supplies for the settlement. The building is now the headquarters of the Royal Historical Society of Queensland and houses the Society's Museum and Library. The booklet illustrates construction of the building as well as later additions, and the restoration undertaken by Queensland's Department of Public Works.
